### Research & Restoration Interns

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS: Successful applicants will have an excellent academic record pursing a degree in engineering, the sciences or any other field relevant for KWF's work, as well as a demonstrated passion and enthusiasm for environmental protection.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES: Interns will work on a variety of environmental projects, from the fieldwork stage to data analysis to report writing. Interns must be motivated, team-oriented and able to do physically demanding field work in backcountry areas. Interns should have a healthy respect for the risks of working in bear country.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS: The outdoor education intern must have great enthusiasm, flexibility, and a desire to work with kids aged 6-12. Prior experience working with children or in outdoor education is definitely a plus. RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES: The intern will assist KWF's education specialist with planning and conducting environmental summer day camp programs for kids aged 6-12.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS: Do you have excellent communication skills in conjunction with strong organizational skills? Are you pursuing a degree in education and/or environmental science? Are you interested in fostering environmental stewardship in others? If so, you would be a good candidate for the Stream Watch Volunteer Program Intern position.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES: The intern will assist the Stream Watch Program Coordinator in volunteer coordination and support while completing river stewardship projects for this award winning peer-to-peer environmental education program.

COMPENSATION: All interns are provided with round-trip airfare from the contiguous US, free housing with a local host family, access to a vehicle, and an hourly wage commensurate with experience.
