The duty station is the Natural Resources Building in Olympia, Washington, although a regional office duty station may be considered.

DUTIES:

The position serves as a statewide biologist providing support to regional staff that process Hydraulic Project Approvals. Primary duties include:

- Review Hydraulic Project Approval applications for completeness.
- Process HPA applications and issue hydraulic project approvals for a subset of project types.
- Compile and analyze data from the HPA database.

QUALIFICATIONS:

B.S. degree in fish, wildlife, or related natural resource science field. Skills and experience necessary for this work include experience in fish and wildlife habitat management, with a focus on habitat concerns, mitigation and state and federal regulatory requirements; and good communications, negotiation/dispute resolution and computer skills:

Expertise and functional proficiency in the Hydraulic Project Approval (HPA) program, including statutes, rules, and policy guidance, and knowledge of and experience with HPA technical issues to effectively identify project impacts and potential mitigation measures for those impacts is preferred.

Functional proficiency in the use of the Hydraulic Permit Management System (HPMS), the webbased database application for HPAs.

Knowledge of fish and wildlife habitat and life history needs and requirements. Additional knowledge of impacts of construction projects on aquatic and riparian habitat and resources, and measures to mitigate those impacts.

Ability to organize, coordinate, or lead program or process activities.

Functional knowledge of the requirements of other environmental permitting and review processes, such as the Growth Management Act, Shoreline Management Act, State Environmental Policy Act, etc.

A valid Washington or other State Driver's License.

Proficient in Microsoft Access, Microsoft Excel, Microsoft Word, and SQL Server Management Studio programs.

Effectively communicates in individual and group discussions, independently analyzes and weighs the risks verses benefits in decisions and recommendations related to fish and wildlife resources, and habitat issues.

Builds rapport and partners with WDFW staff, the public, Indian Tribes, and local, state, and federal governmental agencies regarding issues pertaining to fish and wildlife protection.

Applies negotiation and conflict resolution skills when communicating with difficult people under difficult circumstances.

Uses excellent written and verbal communication skills.

Ability to maintain good working relationships particularly when working with a diverse team of coworkers. Ability to interact with others in a positive manner.

SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION:

Work is performed almost exclusively indoors in an office environment. Standard business hours are Monday – Friday from 8:00a.m. to 5:00p.m, but the incumbent may need to adjust the work schedule to meet business needs. The department will consider a flexible work schedule at the incumbent's request, however this is subject to the supervisor's approval. Some travel is required to meet with regional staff or conduct other business, or attend training.
