

Beach Naturalist Program

The Beach Naturalist Program is a hands on opportunity to work with people who come to our local beaches. Beach Naturalists have the opportunity to work with people who have come to the beach seeking a personal connection with the water. Naturalists work to create a greater understanding of the South Puget Sound and its estuaries. They talk about how everyday choices can have a positive impact on our water quality.

Beach Naturalist volunteers are asked to commit to 18 hours of training followed by a minimum of 5 shifts on the beach during the months of June, July, and August. Program fees apply, please see details on the back of this sheet.

Additional volunteer opportunities include providing interpretation for partnering agencies such as South Sound Green working with school age children and staffing booths at community events or SSEA's popular speaker series.
