The salary range reflects a 3% salary reduction for state employees over the 2011-13 biennium, which was passed by the Legislature effective July 1, 2011 through June 29, 2013.

Working throughout the state, WDFW's employees—field biologists, enforcement officers, land stewards, lab technicians, customer service representatives and others—manage hundreds of fish and wildlife species, maintain nearly a million acres of public wildlife lands, provide opportunities for recreational and commercial fishing, wildlife viewing and hunting, protect and restore habitat and enforce laws that protect fish and wildlife resources.

The Department of Fish and Wildlife is recruiting to fill **four** (4) full time, non-permanent, Fish and Wildlife Biologist 1 positions located in the Wildlife Program, Non-Game Division. The duty station for these positions will be Winthrop WA, with most work in the field capturing and translocating animals, preparing release sites, and collecting monitoring data.

The duration of these positions is anticipated to be from May 1 through October 31 each year beginning in 2013 and continuing at least through 2015.

# **DUTIES:**

These positions serve as field biologists on the Methow Watershed Wetland Restoration Project. Primary duties include but are not limited to:

- Capturing wild beavers from undesirable locations and caring for them in a temporary holding facility. Interacting with landowners at beaver capture sites and coordinating with local biologists and enforcement staff. Identifying, evaluating, and preparing beaver release sites. Transporting beavers to these sites, and monitoring beaver activity at these sites.
- Deploying stream parameter monitoring equipment, collecting stream data, and Downloading and organizing data in computer spread sheets.
- Analyze and write up collected field data. Assist with the production of project reports and publications.
- Work with other professional biologists to refine project protocols, develop new beaver restoration methodology, and train visiting staff from other projects.

• Help with public outreach and education. Give public presentations and attend relevant workshops/conferences and present project accomplishments.

Bachelor's degree in natural resources, zoology, or wildlife.

#### Preferred

At least 3 months previous experience on a moderately strenuous field-based wildlife project.
