

# Summer Bird & Plant Walks

Visit the Adriana Hess Wetland Park while the native flowers and plants are blooming this summer when Tahoma Audubon volunteers will lead free guided bird or native plant walks. Learn about what kind of plants have evolved in this region, and the benefits of planting with natives to attract birds and wildlife to your urban or suburban backyard.

Walk the Donna Cooper Pecos native plant trail, take a close look at wetlands habitat, hear and see birds you haven't discovered before, and learn about native plants that attract wildlife to any backyard. Bring your binoculars, water bottle and sturdy shoes.
