FISH & WILDLIFE BIOLOGIST 2 (Permanent)

The Department of Fish and Wildlife is recruiting to fill one full time permanent Fish & Wildlife Biologist 2 (Private Lands) position located in the Wildlife Program, Region 1. The duty station for this position is in the Walla Walla Field Office, Walla Walla County. Work assignment(s) may take place in Walla Walla and Columbia Counties as necessary.

DUTIES:

The Private Lands Biologist 2 works to obtain fish and wildlife related recreational access on private property. This person assists private landowners to create, improve, and protect fish and wildlife habitat by providing technical assistance through Federal and State conservation programs. The incumbent is the key local agency liaison with the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Services Agency (FSA), and Conservation Districts interacting with these agencies frequently.

Job Duties include:

- Obtain fish and wildlife related recreational access on private property.
- Making and maintaining contacts with landowners, farmers and other conservation partners.
- Evaluating field sites to discern wildlife habitat issues, and to develop wildlife habitat plans to address

those issues.

- Advising landowners and farmers, verbally and in writing, how to improve value to wildlife on their land, and how to integrate such improvements with agricultural goals.
- Seeking out and utilizing appropriate plant materials for ecological restoration of sites for wildlife.
- Implementing field practice trials focused on restoration of wildlife habitat in agricultural settings.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Required Qualifications

This position requires a Bachelor's degree in biology or closely related natural science and at least one year of relevant experience.

Preferred Qualifications

Formal coursework in agronomy, plant sciences, or plant taxonomy with an emphasis on field identification; eexperience with ecological field studies, especially those associated with topics relevant to agricultural production; work with USDA Farm Bill programs.

Key Competencies -- the best qualified applicants will demonstrate abilities in the following areas:

WORKING CONDITIONS

The successful candidate must be willing and able to:

- Work in the field in all weather conditions, walk streams and over rugged terrain up to 30% of the time.
 The work may include exposure to agricultural chemicals and agricultural equipment. Personal Protective equipment is provided.
- Occasional work hours outside of the regular 8:00 am 5:00 pm, Monday Friday work hours including evenings and weekends, occasional early morning, evening, and weekend duties.
- Transport equipment weighing up to 30 pounds over uneven terrain.
- This position involves frequent travel within Columbia and Walla Walla Counties and includes about 50% field activities.
- Safely operate motor vehicles.
