- Accurately and timely processes, records, and organizes HPA application materials and fees and identifies the missing elements of a complete application.
- Responds to internal and external customer requests for data.
- Compiles, evaluates, and reports analysis of application and permit data.
- Distributes completed and issued HPA to applicants, agency staff, and the public.

Interacts with citizens and landowners, tribal biologists, and local, state, and federal government.

#### QUALIFICATIONS:

A Bachelor's Degree in fisheries or wildlife science, natural resource management, or a closely related field. The successful candidate will possess the following qualifications:

- One year of professional experience working as a fish or wildlife biologist or in a closely related field.
