Natural Resource Technician 2 (Full-time; Non-Permanent)

The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife is recruiting to fill one full-time, non-permanent, Natural Resource Technician 2 position located in the Wildlife Program, Region 2; Chelan Wildlife Area. The duty station is the Chelan Wildlife Area Complex with the office located in Wenatchee, Washington. The position will work on Wildlife Area Units throughout Chelan County and may assist on other Wildlife Areas located in Okanogan and Douglas Counties.

The employment period is scheduled for work from April 1, 2014 to December 15, 2014 based on program needs.

DUTIES:

Under the direction of the Chelan Wildlife Area Manager, assist with land management activities on the Chelan Wildlife Area located in Chelan County. The individual in this position performs a variety of technical duties related to land management and development, wildlife habitat restoration, pesticide laws and application, soil conservation, resource protection, and the operation, maintenance, and repair of equipment.

- Drive tractors up to 300hp with attached implements to disk, cultivate, spray, mow, harrow and plant fields to establish and maintain wildlife food plots and native habitat; assess field and vegetation conditions to determine appropriate implement to use; safely connect and disconnect hydraulic lines, PTO shafts and 3-point hitches. Adjust implements as needed to optimize effectiveness.
- Safely load, secure and transport tractors and implements using equipment trailers.
- Maintain and repair equipment and vehicles including diesel powered tractors, gas powered vehicles, ATVs, gas powered small engines, farm implements, and irrigation equipment. Replace or repair as needed worn or damaged parts on farming implements, tractors, vehicles, and other essential equipment as needed. Change motor oil, spark plugs, air filters, mower blades, and sharpen chainsaws.
- Vegetation management including planting, weeding, and pruning trees and shrubs, mowing weeds with tractors and weed whackers, and using chainsaws.
- Assess field and vegetation conditions to determine timing of pesticide applications, seeding, and plant establishment.
- Safely apply herbicides to control noxious weeds.
- Construct and maintain fences (barbed wire, woven wire, split rail) including installing posts, braces, gates, and rock jacks. Maintain surface of gravel trails, mow trail edges, and prune encroaching tree and shrubs.
- Perform sub-journey work in the construction and repair of buildings, kiosks, and other structures; roadways, trails, fences, and wildlife water developments. Estimate materials and time needed to complete the job.
- Monitor public use of the area; maintain good safety and public relations practices; provide department information; advise enforcement personnel of potentially illegal or disruptive actions. Make recommendations for signage and post regulatory/informational signs.
- Maintain daily activity, vehicle use and repair records.

- Safely use and store hazardous substances (e.g., pesticides).
- Repair barbed wire and woven wire fences including gates, H-braces and rock jacks.
- Use and maintain vehicles, equipment and tools including: hand tools, chain saws, drills, welders, grinders, saws, pumps, cranes, manual and portable chain hoists, sprayers, mowers, weed eaters, pickup trucks, ATV's, heavy equipment, and snow removal equipment; and pull and maneuver small trailers.

- Effectively and safely operate and perform basic maintenance on farm machinery, ATV's, standard highway vehicles, boats, trailer, and power and hand tools.
